WHY I AM A FRIEND By Barbara Gottfried

Did you ever feel so strongly about something that you just had to be a part of it? Have you ever felt that you owed a debt that you passionately wanted to pay back? That was me many years ago, when a small group of us sat in a circle in the Community Room forming what would be the first group of *Friends* of the Middle Country Public Library.

I grew up in a town in Queens with a very small library. But every Friday after school my mother would take us to the "Story Hour", after which we (I was one of 7 children) would all pick out the books we would read for the week. We didn't have the money for our own books, so the library was a gold mine and we were permitted to have as many riches as we could carry. A love of reading and a love of learning started there. My mother taught us that we could learn and accomplish anything through reading and by following through on the knowledge we had acquired through our literary pursuits.

Many years and a Ph.D. later, I came to MCPL. If the little Poppenheusen Library in College Point was the gold mine, MCPL was the national treasure! And what was even more wonderful, was that I was being given the opportunity to pay back my debt to libraries by supporting this treasure through my efforts in the *Friends*. I became involved in many of the *Friends'* projects and felt a wonderful sense of pride in seeing tangible additions made to the MCPL through our fund raising efforts, encouraging patron participation in library budget votes to continue its wonderful works, and yearly increases in the number of patrons participating in our membership. How my family and I would have reveled in the programs, media, learning opportunities, and voluminous acquisitions available through MCPL! And our heads would have spun at being able to purchase and possess our OWN book from the *Friends'* book sales!

My enthusiasm and my linkage to the *Friends* and to MCPL have only strengthened through the years. As I watch young children and their families utilize and enjoy MCPL, and as I bring my own grandchildren here, I can only hope and wish that they are infused with the joy of reading, the zest of learning, the elation of accomplishment and the pride of being part of this national treasure!


